MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JULIE

Dear friends in Christ,

At the end of 2025, the congregation adopted a new mission statement: "Joyfully living by grace through faith to worship, love, and serve." It is my hope that in 2026, we will spend time exploring this statement, understanding and internalizing it, and eventually learning to live in to it. This is how we have defined who we are as a church and what we are here to do.

It seems fitting that at the start of the year, we would look at the start of the new mission statement. What does it mean to be "joyfully living?"

First, let's agree that happiness and joy are not the same thing. Joy, in fact, is not even truly an emotion. We can experience joy on our happiest days and even on our darkest days. Joy is deeper and more complex than a fleeting emotion.

Joy is produced in us by the Holy Spirit. It causes us to see the beauty of Christ in the **word** and in the **world**. Joy is a practice and a behavior, deliberate and intentional. Joy becomes a state of being that changes how we live so that we can "live joyfully."

Jesus says to the disciples in John 15:11, "I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete." This comes immediately after the verses that begin, "I am the vine; you are the branches," indicating joy is the result of realizing our connectedness to God and our connectedness to each other. How might this realization affect how we feel and how we live?

His Holiness the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu, two men who have experienced incredible suffering in their lives, teamed up in 2016 to write a book about the joy they experience entitled, "The Book of Joy." Together, they explore the nature of joy itself as they share their personal experiences of both happiness and suffering.

Jesus shares his very own joy with us and desires for our joy to be complete. He wants joy to be a defining characteristic of our lives. As we begin 2026, I wonder what the Holy Spirit is doing in and among us to grow our joy and to inspire us to share joy with others. Let's wonder that together!

Speaking of joy...on behalf of myself, the office staff, and our contractors, I want to extend special thanks for the Christmas cards, gifts, and love offerings given by the congregation. You shared your joy with us with outrageous generosity. Our joy was increased in experiencing your love.




BIG WORRIES CAN BE OVERWHELMING.





SHOEBOX SCRAMBLE

The Joy in Christ Shoe Box Golf Scramble this past summer was a huge success! It not only gave us the opportunity for fellowship and evangelism but, as a missions project, raised over one thousand dollars (that's \$1000+) to fund monetary grants to underprivileged students at Mountain Pine and Jessievile High Schools. The Missions Team elected to supplement the money raised by the golf program to provide checks in the amounts of \$600 for each school. The funds were non-restricted and the schools could choose the program that best fit their needs.



Mountain Pine will use the grant money to purchase supplies for their Hygiene Closet. The closet is stocked with necessary products including emergency clothing, shoes, school supplies, medical products, etc. and is open to students every school day to obtain any item they need, no questions asked. The only rule is that they take only what they need so that there will always be enough for everyone who has a requirement. Student Councilor Lillian Alderman accepted the check from Dick Coulson, Shoe Box Scramble Coordinator with Pastor Julie Wesley and Karen and Terry Sterzik, Missions Team members, also attending.

Jessievile High School Principal Michael Spraggins accepted the check from Dick Coulson while Chris Benson, Assistant Councilor, Pastor Julie, and Karen Sterzik looked on. Principal Mike expressed thanks for the donation and noted that the school has a program to assist students with difficult financial or personal situations where this grant would be very useful.

This was the most successful year we have had for the Shoe Box Golf Scramble and the participants are to be congratulated for their efforts and generosity. Watch for the sign up sheet in the Narthex and announcements in the service bulletins next March or April for the next opportunity to do God's work while having fun, good fellowship, and raising money for a very worthy cause. Even if you don't play golf, you are still invited to come to dinner and join in the fun!


