I read somewhere a long time ago that the name of God, YHWH, is actually breath sounds. When we breathe in, we make the sound YH; when we breathe out, we make the sound WH. Every breath we take proclaims the name of God. In worship, as we are breathing together to sing, to pray, and to confess our faith, we are collectively and repeatedly proclaiming the name of God to each other and to the world.

God breathed God's very own breath, the breath of life, into the nostrils of humans at creation to make them come alive (Genesis 2:7). We know scientifically that respiration, pulling oxygen in and pushing carbon dioxide out, is essential to staying alive.

Maybe, what it means to be alive is to continually proclaim that God is here and God is good.




We then gathered on the patio at Cafe Isabella to pass the shoe box to generously support the kids at Mountain Pine and Jessieville





Oct. 5th Love Lunches




It will be our joy to once again serve as God's hands in feeding the hungry at Love Lunches on October 5th. We had several requests for peanut butter again when we served in August.


If you would like to help, please donate a 16 oz. jar of peanut butter by Oct. 5th.
