Salvador Dali's *The Persistence of Memory* is a painting that has always captured my imagination. I saw a print of it for the first time as a teenager, hanging on the wall of a local pizza parlor. In the painting there are three clocks that seem to be melting, losing their form, almost like uncooked, hanging pizza dough. Scholars have written volumes interpreting this piece of art, but most agree Dali is saying something about time and the impermanence of everything. (You can view the painting at the Museum of Modern Art in New York City or by visiting their website here.)

Biblical authors write about time in a variety of ways, but there are multiple instances of time being described as limited with an urging for the readers to use it wisely. (See Job 14 and 1 Corinthians 7 as examples.) In these cases, time is considered a provision of God entrusted to us for the purpose of using time to glorify God, to serve others, and to enjoy the blessings God provides.


The month of June will begin with the celebration of two major feasts: Pentecost and Holy Trinity. Immediately after these festivals we move into Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time tends to be a season of less activity in the church with no big celebrations scheduled until the end of October. It is by design that we are less busy during the summer and the fall; this time is held as a season of growth and renewal. It is a time for learning and reflecting; it is a time established specifically for the development and growth of our faith.

As we begin the long, green season, I urge you to not let this time be wasted. We are stewards of the time God has given us in our lives. Before these weeks begin to fly past us, make conscious choices about how your time will be spent, prioritizing that which is important and avoiding those activities that waste our precious, limited time. Consider how you will use this gift from God and how you can give the gift of your time to others.

May the peace of Christ be with you, every minute of every day of this ordinary season.

GETTING TO KNOW ZACHARY WESLEY.....Musically!

We see Zachary each week at church and once in a while, he treats us to his music ability. He is an extremely talented musician not to mention - - - he's just a nice guy!!!!!!!

Zach was born April 2, 2007 - (he just missed being a "joke"!!!) which makes him 18 years old. His life is in music and just recently has accomplished attaining a few awards.

Zach started playing music in 2019, 6th grade. Pastor Julie says that she first noticed a special talent during the spring of 2020. Zachary was in 6th grade and still a beginner. I heard him play "arhydynos", a common hymn tune. I was amazed I could recognize something he was playing - - it wasn't just noise!

The first day he held his clarinet, Julie and Zach went to see his grandmother, who was an accomplished clarinetist. She taught him how to place the mouthpiece in his mouth to make a sound. Needless to say, it was amusing to watch.

This was only the beginning. Zachary plays clarinet, bass guitar and does vocals. He is in the choral group at school.

Recently, Zachary won \$1000 by winning the competition of Arts Across Arkansas. This organization is to celebrate high school artists of several different mediums, from film, to visual art, to composition. The piece that was played by the quartet at Pastor Julie's ordination was Zacharay's first composition and it was this composition that won him \$1,000 from Arts Across Arkansas.....at the age of 17.

Now he will be attending the Sewanee Summer Music Festial for a five week program in Sewanee, Tennessee. It is open from high-schoolers through and incuding graduate students. Zach was accepted into the Composition Intensive portion of this five week seminar where he will be attending master classes, seminars, studio classes, and recitals. By the end of this program, Zach will have completed at least three original compositions. Zach was one of only four people selected for the Composition Instensive portion of the festival Nationally. This festival runs approximately \$5,000 if you are selected. Zach was fortunate that at Jerry Nolte's passing, donations were made to Kiwanis Cub of Hot Springs Village and it was from this fund, with Kiwanis matching the donations, a scholarship was awarded to Zach for this Festival.

Zachary attends the Arkansas School for Math, Science, and the Arts in Hot Springs, Arkansas. This is only a beginning for Zach - and with the accomplishments already made, he indeed will become a true Professional Musician.

We are so very fortunate to be witnessing the growth of a young musician. He is our Cantor, he plays clarinet with the hymns, wrote a special composition for his mom's ordination, works the sound system of the church and helps wherever he is asked. A very special person - - - wouldn't you say???????!!!!!

Congratulations, Zachary, on your recent accomplishments and we wish you the very best in all your future accomplishments.
